For those of you who were at the Cancer Council's Biggest Morning Tea the other week and were treated to a slice of Beth Baillie's "Cherry Ripe Cheesecake", today is your lucky day! Beth has kindly provided the recipe for you to try at home. And....I have already made it TWICE! Thanks so much Beth for supplying the recipe for the members to enjoy.



Cherry Choc Coconut Cheesecake

Base

½ cup desiccated coconut

1 pkt Arnotts chocolate ripple biscuits (or homebrand)

100gm butter

Break biscuits and put in food processor. Blitz until well crumbed. Add coconut and blitz until well blended. Melt butter in microwave and add, only blitz until just blended. Press firmly into 10" spring form cake tin. Refrigerate while you make the rest.

Middle

Into the clean food processor put

2 x 250gm cream cheese (Broken up)

¼ cup caster sugar

1/3 of 680gm jar of cherries

Put **3 x tsp powdered gelatine** into a cup, add **1/3 cup of cold water** and stir until dissolved, immediately add **1/3 cup boiling water** (or as per gelatine box instructions). Ensure all gelatine is dissolved and add to processor and after a few pulses blitz, stop and wipe down sides and blitz again, ensure you have a smooth blend.

Meanwhile...in a large bowl whip **300ml cream** with **1 Tbsp icing sugar** and **5ml vanilla essence** until peaks form.

Add the mix from the processor to the cream and whisk together then fold in **1/3 jar of well drained cherries**.

Use spatula or similar to spread the mix onto the biscuit base. Place last **1/3 jar of cherries**, again well drained, around the edge of the cheesecake.

Topping (chocolate sauce)

1/3 cup of cream microwaved to boiling.

Add 80gm Dark chocolate

1 big tspn of golden syrup

A few drops of vanilla essence.

Stir together until smooth. Let cool before spooning over the cheesecake. Sprinkle with desiccated coconut and grated chocolate or chocolate sprinkles.

PROGRESS The event organisation is now in the most important period of addressing the outstanding activities to be completed to ensure a professional, quality and safe event on the 12th of August. See below for detail. The next team meeting is scheduled for Tuesday the 11th of July 2023 at the usual venue.

FINANCE With equipment either being borrowed from other events, or personally owned, and nearing the end of its usable life or now in personal use, the event is seeking funding from the WACC Inc budget to ensure that the event is conducted safely and professionally this year and into the future. Detail has been supplied in a formal request to the club via other media.

COURSE The course has been finalised and the MA Course Check of the Road Book has been completed with the results being assessed by the COC. The Road Book will be revised accordingly.

EQUIPMENT See finance above in regard to replacement of, and acquisition of additional equipment requirements to support the safety and growth of this event and into the future. BACK IN THE DAY

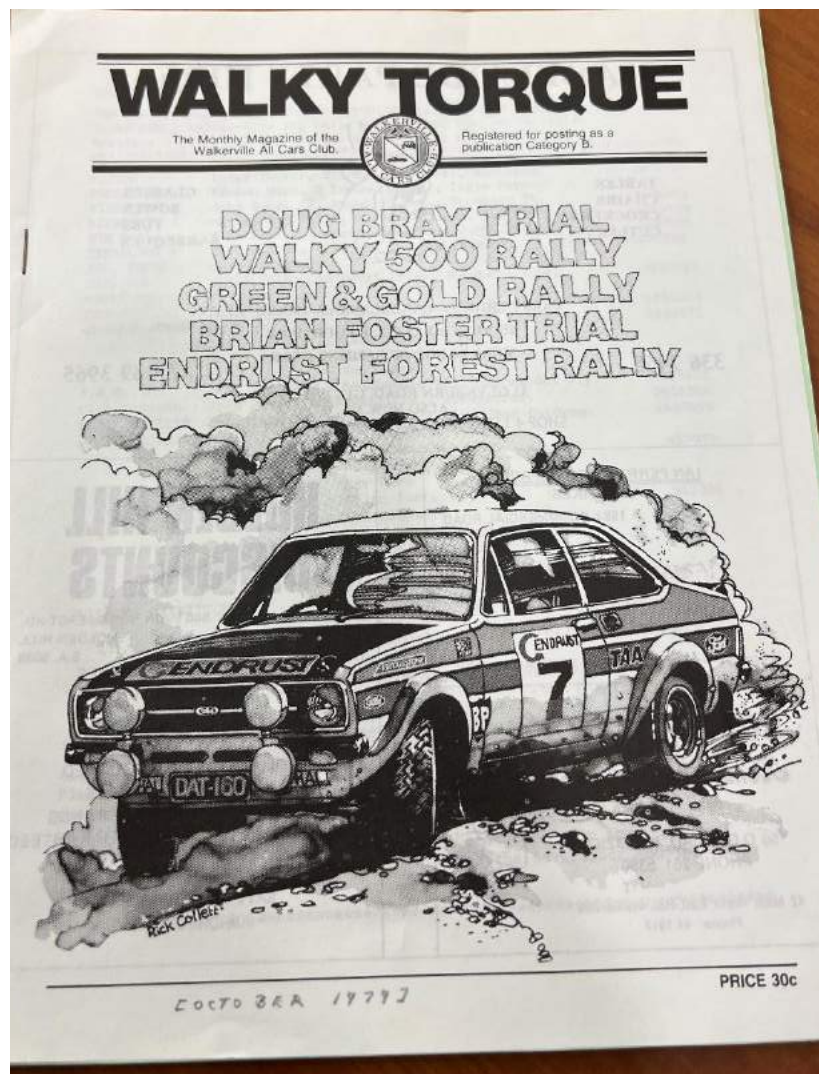
I have an interest in history, and with the clubs 70th anniversary coming up next year, it was a good opportunity to do a bit of research. Off to the State Library.....

Club member now the Editor of the Motor Mag "Chequered Flag" is advertising rally goods for sale in the mag. Acompetition is being held to design a tee shirt for the club.

PAST EVENTS -

Mud Sprint - Co-organised between SDCC, Ford Owners and WACC at Southern Districts grounds on 4th August. There were 37 entries on the day with 9 from our club. The track was very wet and slippery as the Ford owners found out with standard road tyres.

We all managed to obtain a practice run before lunch and the event got under way at approx. 1.30 pm. First official run saw myself in Datsun 1600 set fastest time with Kym Fetke (SDCC) in VW special close behind. Second run Kym managed to set fastest time with myself 0.7 sec. behind and on last and final run I again managed to set fastest time followed by Phil Lemm in a Renault.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

JUNE 1975

We have now reached the half-way mark of this year. Generally, the first half of the year has been busy for the club members, and with more or less a similar itinerary, the final half looks to be no less busy. Membership renewal has slowed lately, and I take this opportunity to ask those of you who have friends who may be interested in joining, to bring them along to a night run or general meeting to meet other members, and perhaps ultimately join the club.

The first event of this current month was the night run organised by Dorothy Hickmore. From some of the few who attended, I understand that the event was very good with an excellent finish. Unfortunately, both from the competitors and Dot's point of view, the night was terrible weatherwise, with low temperatures, rain and wind, all of which tends to reduce the numbers who would otherwise compete.

The next day saw the running of the Motorkhana at Two Wells. Although I would have thought that the event may have been called off due to bad weather, this was not the case, and those people who were able to negotiate the mud roads to the ground, apparently enjoyed a very good event, although traction was not all it could have been.

Last Saturday night saw the running of the Green and Gold Rally. With thirty one starters, the event left the start at John Millers, proceeded to a division break at The Pinery, and onto a somewhat late finish at Balhannah. I believe that only three crews finished the event in time, with clubmen Ian Holt and Chris Risonico provisionally second outright. Retirement seems to have helped your navigation Chris!

Clubman Ron McLeod was present at scrutineering for the Green and Gold, and managed to sell 15 of our initial purchase of 20 maps. He had no trouble in selling the remainder at the start on Saturday. The committee has established four outlets for maps, Carmen Ricci in the Greater Southern area, Des Collins in the Western, Colin Pettigrew in the Eastern, and Ron McLeod the Northern suburbs. I wish to thank these members for their co-operation in this venture, and special thanks to Ron for co-ordinating map supplies and arranging distribution of them. Please remember these outlets when you or your friends wish to buy any of the 1:50,000 metric maps or $\frac{1}{2}$ " to the mile county plans.

On Tuesday, 10th June, Don Sims, Russell Knight, Mike Terzic and myself, attended the inaugural meeting of the South Australian Motor Racing Club Inc. on behalf of the club. Basically the idea of the steering committee has been to fill the large gap left when the Mallala circuit was closed. The club intends to build a rally course circuit at first, followed later by a bitumen sprint circuit, and then a go-karting circuit as phases one, two and three respectively. Projected cost of the rally course circuit is about \$10,000 which will be raised by subscription at a rate of \$100 joining fee plus \$10 renewal per year. The idea is to run along the lines of Calder with far greater emphasis on club level activities than is available at present from A.I.R. I shall elaborate more at the meeting.
