## BACK IN THE DAY

# Rallying since the late 1960's – Lyn Wilson

How it all started – 19	<b>964</b> □ 1	1968 □	2021

It was orienteering that ultimately found me involved in a 50 year obsession with Rallying. So, what is orienteering?

Orienteering is a group of sports that require navigational skills using a map and compass to navigate from point to point in diverse and usually unfamiliar terrain whilst moving at speed.

Participants are given a topographical map, usually a specially prepared orienteering map, which they use to find control points.

Originally a training exercise in land navigation for military officers, orienteering has developed many variations. Among these, the oldest and the most popular is foot orienteering. For the purposes of this article, foot orienteering serves as a point of departure for discussion of all other variations, but almost any sport that involves racing against a clock and requires navigation with a map is a type of orienteering.

Although not mentioned in the definition above one could carry it across to Rallying without much question, especially considering the form Rallying took from the 1960's and early to mid 1970's, which included: navigational skills using a map, cars definitely had a compass with an objective of finding control points within a time frame.

It was after one Orienteering event, conducted by what is now known as the Adelaide University Mountain Club and over a couple of lemonades in the Uni Bar, we were reliving our efforts (just like we do in rallying today) I was approached with the question "how would you like to do that in a car?" I thought this person was a bit on the wrong side of reality but we had a chat and a crazy plan was hatched.

#### It was now 1968.

So, a Ford Anglia 105E was sourced from the car yard that the owner driver managed and an entry into my first orienteering event in a car was submitted.


