One of the worthy recipients was former Walkerville Car Club member, the late Stewart McLeod. For those of you old enough to remember he was a six times winner of the South Australian Rally Championship, twice runner up Australian Rally Champion and more significantly the organiser of the 1979 Repco Round Australia Trial. He was also the CAMS representative on the 1977 Singapore Airlines London to Sydney Rally. I had the privilege of accepting the award on behalf of the McLeod family with his eldest son, Kenton also attending. It was a fabulous night with great stories, excellent visuals and guest speaker, Ed Ordinski, who was exceptional as always.

Or, if you're a competitor who is willing to assist with timing or as a senior official, you'll be eligible to receive either full or average points in the series for the round you help with.
