Hello Everyone! It's newsletter time again, and your CompSec Monthly update!

Recent Events:

Since our last newsletter the first round of our Club Khanacross Series has been run and won! **Bridge Powdercoating Khant Get Better than this! - Khanacross Round 1** was a great day. It had a mix of tracks that used some older sections of track that haven't been used in some time.

Unfortunately, due to a spike in Covid, our entries were a little less than expected with several people pulling out just before the event. Even with a few last minute withdrawals we still had a solid field of 21 entries and an incredibly close race for 2nd through to 4th. After a slightly bumpy start and some confusion around how the runs would work (which was mostly my fault because I apparently don't know left from right) things settled down and we managed to complete 12 runs over 8 different layouts.

The outright winner on the day was **Osscar Farnden**. He is one of the up and coming Juniors and is definitely one to keep an eye on. He took home a comfortable win with a time of 19:29.93 which was over a minute ahead of second place Sam Humphries.

The competition for the other two podum places, however, was a completely different story, with second, third and fourth all within 2 seconds. **Sam Humphries, Ethan Pickstock and Gary Raymond** had an incredibly close day trading times back and forth, but Sam managed to come through just ahead with a time of 20:32.07. Ethan clocked in at 20:32.62 and Gary close behind on 20:33.13. Not only was this incredibly close, with just 55 hundredths between Sam and Ethan, but this level of timing accuracy would not have been possible without the new beam timing system.

Gary put in a great showing being faster than Sam and Ethan in the morning, but the afternoon's tighter tracks must have favored the 2WDs and Sam and Ethan were able to make up the time they lost in the morning against Gary and the Green Machine.
