Our assessment of the car is as follows:

- The car will not start.
- The engine turns over, has spark, gets air, but no fuel is getting the cylinders.
- Can't hear the fuel pump prime.
- Put a few litres of fuel in it so to be sure it was not empty.
- Examined the fuel filter and it stinks of stale fuel.
- Suspicious the fuel pump is faulty as well as the fuel being bad.
- It could also have trouble with the fuel injectors, etc.
- Suspect the car has not run for many years.
- The car needs new tyres all round.
- It will need new spark plugs.
- The valve cover has a bad leak.
- It will need an Air filter.
- It's likely to need brake pads and or rotors.
- It is low on oil and will need to be changed.
- The brake fluid is very low.... means there is an issue there.
- Needs a new radiator cap.... it's perished.
- Needs a battery.
- Battery needs a secure bracket.

Almost 100 pre-1931 vehicles from various clubs were on show. This number, bolstered by the inclusion of some younger ones, was achieved at each of the subsequent annual events held in the Parklands. As the Parklands site is now being used by the South Australian Government, the display has been moved to the Barratt Reserve at West Beach. This March will be the 18th consecutive running of the Historic Motor Vehicle Gathering, which now includes classic vehicles too; and incorporates a display of operating stationary engines.

Entry is free for owners who wish to display their vehicles. It is also free for spectators. The next Gathering will be on Sunday 16 March 2025 from 10.00am to 2.00pm at Barratt Reserve, West Beach Road, West Beach.

RALLY SKILLS PROGRAM - 2025

Goals of Rally Skills Program

The Rally Skills Program's goals are to provide a safe space for young people and adults to learn and develop skills driving on gravel, with an emphasis on providing a gateway into Motorsport.

By developing a driver education program, we aim to educate drivers on the skills required to drive on gravel, as well as learn general driving skills. We will provide students an outlet to learn in a safe environment, being taught by experienced instructors in a family-friendly environment.

Students will use a supplied vehicle during the Program, to get experience and decide if they would like to pursue the sport, before having to outlay equipment and a vehicle, which can be a barrier to people participating.

The program aims to provide on ongoing support to assist students of the program to continue to develop skills and further their careers. We hope to start a buddy system where a participant can continue to be mentored by another club member to help them increase their skills and continue into the next level of Motorsport.

The program consists of 3 full day sessions/lessons with final event day when students get the opportunity to compete in a Walkerville All Cars Club Khanacross. The program will run once per year. A maximum of 12 students, split into two groups of 6.



RALLY SKILLS PROGRAM - 2025

Goals of Rally Skills Program

Day 1 of the program - 5th April

Please arrive by 9:00am as we will need to complete some paperwork, and everyone needs to sign on to be covered by insurance. There will be a drivers' briefing at 9:30. This is compulsory for both students and trainers/officials. Safety is paramount and the first sessions will cover car and personal safety, allocate students to their groups, how to put on a helmet, correct seating position and scrutineering of the RSP cars. After lunch, we will start working on cornering, weight transfer and stop/start, both theory and in car. Cars will be provided by RSP.

Day 2 of the program - 28th June

Activities will include cornering/gear changes, left foot braking, rally rules, Co-driver duties, pace notes, tyre technology and how to change a tyre safely.

Day 3 of the program - 27th September

Activities will include reinforcing day 1 & 2 skills, dummy Khanacross track, Event entry via Motorsport Australia (MA) portal, cost of building a Khanacross car, loading and towing a car trailer safely, Fire safety including extinguishing a fire.

Day 4 of the program - 26th October

You will participate in a timed Khanacross competition. Using your knowledge from day 3, you will be responsible to enter the event via the MA portal (we will assist if you have any problems). If you have your own car, you may use it for day 4 provided it passes scrutineering on the day, other wise a RSP car will be allocated to you.

EXPRESSION OF INTEREST INSTRUCTORS



We would like another couple of club members to get themselves accredited as coaches for the program. We have been running a bit lean on numbers and if we have a few people unavailable due to travel commitments or sickness we are very tight to run the day. You will need to get a Working with Children Check before registering with MA as a coach, which takes an hour or so. It is also a good way to hone your own skills.

Please contact Peter Tann on 0417867403 (or any of the RSP team) if you are interested, or would like to find out more.

Depending on the budget (which is yet to be set) we are keen to start to install bolt-in half cages in the RSP cars as a priority.

If anyone is able to assist us in the process please contact Pete.

We have harnesses for all the cars which still need to be fitted.

We have a couple of seats that have been donated and need fitting.
