Unfortunately, the PW Mayflower had engine problems in the morning and was towed back to dock and we were unable to cruise in the afternoon as planned.


It was fixed by Tuesday, so that is good.

Dear Motorsport Australia Officials,

We would like to inform you of an update to the way you can request to officiate at events internationally.

Officials can use the newly <u>updated online form</u> to apply for an Officials Letter of Introduction or No Objection Letter.

Officials Letter of Introduction Online Form

What is the Officials Letter of Introduction or a No Objection Letter?

A Letter of Introduction also known as a No Objection Letter allows an Official to participate overseas. This will ensure an Official from Motorsport Australia is cleared and approved to officiate at your intended event.

Who can apply for this letter?

Any active Motorsport Australia Official can apply for this letter. Those that are pending or suspended are ineligible to apply. All applicants will be assessed before a letter is issued.

What is the process once I have applied for this letter?

After an application is submitted, the key event contact will be contacted. This key event contact can range from other ASNs (such as Formula 1 events) to event organisers (such as ADAC or CREVENTIC (24H Series i.e Dubai 24 Hour, 24 Hour of Spa etc). The length of time to process this letter will depend on the ASN/organiser and awaiting allocation of positions and approval. If the Organiser/ASN is non-responsive we will look to contact the applicant. The ASN/organiser will then be supplied your Letter of Introduction. Applicants will not receive the letter.

RALLY SKILLS PROGRAM - 2025

Goals of Rally Skills Program

The Rally Skills Program's goals are to provide a safe space for young people and adults to learn and develop skills driving on gravel, with an emphasis on providing a gateway into Motorsport.

By developing a driver education program, we aim to educate drivers on the skills required to drive on gravel, as well as learn general driving skills. We will provide students an outlet to learn in a safe environment, being taught by experienced instructors in a family-friendly environment.

Students will use a supplied vehicle during the Program, to get experience and decide if they would like to pursue the sport, before having to outlay equipment and a vehicle, which can be a barrier to people participating.

The program aims to provide on ongoing support to assist students of the program to continue to develop skills and further their careers. We hope to start a buddy system where a participant can continue to be mentored by another club member to help them increase their skills and continue into the next level of Motorsport.

The program consists of 3 full day sessions/lessons with final event day when students get the opportunity to compete in a Walkerville All Cars Club Khanacross. The program will run once per year. A maximum of 12 students, split into two groups of 6.



RALLY SKILLS PROGRAM - 2025

Goals of Rally Skills Program

Day 1 of the program - 5th April

Please arrive by 9:00am as we will need to complete some paperwork, and everyone needs to sign on to be covered by insurance. There will be a drivers' briefing at 9:30. This is compulsory for both students and trainers/officials. Safety is paramount and the first sessions will cover car and personal safety, allocate students to their groups, how to put on a helmet, correct seating position and scrutineering of the RSP cars. After lunch, we will start working on cornering, weight transfer and stop/start, both theory and in car. Cars will be provided by RSP.

Day 2 of the program - 28th June

Activities will include cornering/gear changes, left foot braking, rally rules, Co-driver duties, pace notes, tyre technology and how to change a tyre safely.

Day 3 of the program - 27th September

Activities will include reinforcing day 1 & 2 skills, dummy Khanacross track, Event entry via Motorsport Australia (MA) portal, cost of building a Khanacross car, loading and towing a car trailer safely, Fire safety including extinguishing a fire.

Day 4 of the program - 26th October

You will participate in a timed Khanacross competition. Using your knowledge from day 3, you will be responsible to enter the event via the MA portal (we will assist if you have any problems). If you have your own car, you may use it for day 4 provided it passes scrutineering on the day, other wise a RSP car will be allocated to you.



FEBRUARY GENERAL MINUTES - 2025

State Council:	 Discussion surrounding Event Entry system via Motorsport Australia. It is noted that Supplementary Regulations can be posted with entries accepted as 'pending'. However, entries may not be marked as 'accepted' until Supplementary Regulations have been approved. State Council reminded Clubs that Panel and Committee Chairs must be ratified by State Council before handover can take place. A Stewards information day was recently hosted by Motorsport Australia, with good attendance by WACC members. Grant funding is currently available for AEDs (de-fibs). The State Awards Presentation night is on 28th February at the Arkaba Hotel. Ticket allocations will re-open soon via Eventbrite. The Motorsport Australia Event Entry system has multiple automated notifications built into the system. Clubs and competitors were reminded to opt in or out of relevant notifications.
Competition Secretary:	 First event at Walky Park is on 6th April. Several sponsors are being sought for Walky Park rounds. Discussion held surrounding sourcing of Motorsport Australia Stewards.
Track Maintenance:	 Plumbing is being undertaken to connect the new mains water supply to the existing tanks and toilets. Discussion held surrounding solar and plumbing options for future upgrades at Walky Park.
Rally Skills Program:	 The 2025 Rally Skills Program is fully subscribed. Tow straps have been fitted to 5 if the RSP vehicles. All documentation and training sessions has been delivered for program delivery. Extra coaches have been engaged to further supplement the Program. The Club thanks Des Collins for the donation of a Rattle Gun set.
Social Committee	There has been 27 people entered in the upcoming Observation Run.
Website:	The website is currently under review for ongoing updates. Club Members were encouraged to submit any relevant or historical club data to the Web team.
General Business:	 WACC is the supporting the SARP launch day at The Bend. The SARP has offered the Club space to have a promotional booth to engage with volunteers, competitors, sponsors, and prospectives.
